Medical Bill Reimbursement (HB)

This bill sets up a refund process for patients eligible for free healthcare, but who paid a hospital bill.

Background:

A legislatively-mandated report from the Health Services Cost Review Commission found that Maryland hospitals likely collected \$60 million per year in 2017 and 2018, from individuals who qualified for free care.

In 2022, another legislatively-mandated task force was created to find and implement a process of reimbursing individuals who qualified for free care, but were charged and paid those charges from 2017 to 2021.

The Solution:

This bill incorporates the recommendations of the task force into law to implement the refund process for those patients who were eligible for free care, but paid a bill.

- → Hospitals will identify all patients who paid an out-of-pocket expense for dates of service between 2017 and 2021 and share that data with the Comptroller's office.
- → The Comptroller's office will identify who was eligible for free care based on income and pass the remaining data on to DHS (or MDH or MSDE as applicable).
- → DHS will identify who was eligible for free care based on presumptive eligibility:
 - Households with children in the free or reduced meals program,
 - ◆ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) participants,
 - ◆ Low-income-household energy assistance program participants,
 - ◆ Primary Adult Care Program (PAC) participants, until such time as inpatient benefits are added to the PAC benefit package, and
 - ◆ Women, Infants and Children (WIC) participants.
- → Those identified as eligible (by the offices above) will be contacted by the hospital to be informed that they may be due a refund.
- → Considering the use of Comptroller and DHS data, applicants will not need to confirm income status, the hospital need only check if the applicant paid a bill in the year in question and if an asset test was used to determine eligibility.
- → Hospitals will provide a refund to patients who were eligible for free care but paid their bills for care between 2017 and 2021.
- → Hospitals will reimburse the agencies for effort spent based on the percentage of patients billed by their hospital.
